**Orofacial Myology:** If not addressed immediately, orofacial myofunctional disorders such as digit-sucking, tongue thrust and habitual oral breathing, can result in years of costly orthodontic treatment and other long-lasting hardships. Orofacial myofunctional therapy gives speech-language pathologists a different point of view on misarticulation problems. School clinicians may find the identification of myofunctional disorders especially helpful since they are limited in what they can do to address the issues that are at the base of misarticulation.
